

HANNAH LIM

Hannah Lim makes work in response to Orientalism, the colonial romanticisation of the East, with a particular focus on the eighteenth-century aesthetic trend of 'Chinoiserie'. Through the production of anthropomorphic, intricate sculptures, that oscillate playfully between function and ornament, Lim's practice engages with cultural exchanges between the Europe and South and South-East Asia. Lim seeks to reclaim and reimagine a dialogue between East and West, while examining the complex configurations of power and identity conferred historically by 'Chinoiserie'.

Hannah Lim studied Sculpture at The University of Edinburgh before going on to complete her MFA at the Ruskin School of Art, Oxford. She has exhibited widely across the UK, including solo shows at Commonage Projects (2022), and Edinburgh Printmakers (2022). She has also exhibited in several group exhibitions, including Bloomberg New Contemporaries at South London Galleries (2022). She is the recipient of multiple awards, such as the Hospitalfield Residency (2021), the Home Residency by Ronan Mckenzie and Cob Gallery (2021), selected for RSA New Contemporaries (2022) and is currently Pangolin London's 2022-2023 Artist in Residence.


GEORGE YOUNG







LIAM FALLON


Liam Fallon (b. 1995) was born In Stoke on Trent and now lives and works in London. He Graduated from Manchester School of Art in 2017 and has gone on to exhibit both nationally and internationally including Voidoid Archive, Glasgow, Sluice Art Fair, New York and DUVE Berlin. Shortly after graduating, he was awarded 2nd place at the Woon Prize and in both 2018 and 2020, was shortlisted for the Mark Tanner Sculpture Prize. 


DJ ROBERTS



RUFUS NEWELL

Rufus Newell born 1991, lives and works in Leeds. He graduated from Leeds arts University in 2013. In 2023 he was selected for the Trinity Buoy wharf drawing award 2023, was included in definitions of drawing II, and was awarded the Joan Day painting bursary. As well as exhibiting comprehensively in both solo and group shows he is a founding member of the Precious art collective.




The recipient of the Joan Day Painting Bursary, Newell has created a rich and engaging body of work, with generous lashings of colour using oil bars, oil paint and pastels. The result is a series of new and reworked drawings and paintings, neatly brought together in South Square's intimate gallery spaces. Creating drawings in both 2D and 3D, Newell combines materials to create layered surfaces that are full of emotional depth and pictorial complexity. Each time he returns to a particular piece, adding layers and colours and a density of materials, a new story is created. In this way, each work contains traces of his explorative working method. Rufus is an artist on the cusp of illustrational greatness. A recent project of Rufus' is Hercules and his Club an illustrated zine. The Risograph printed publication displays the illustrator "working with honesty and immediacy, desire and denial, joy and trepidation," he tells It's Nice That. "I use drawing to respond to my surroundings while keeping an intuitive grasp on the imaginative world." Rufus certainly taps into an inventive narrative within his zine that illustrates the Greek gods. "Recently I have been looking at folklore, classical greek sculptures, and stories of war, gods, and heroes."




MARILYN HALLAM




IWAN LEWIS

Iwan Lewis (b. North Wales) based Ynys Môn, is an artist who graduated from BA (Hons) Fine Art at UWIC, Cardiff in 2002 and MA Painting, Royal College of Art, London in 2011. Lewis has exhibited extensively for the last two decades.




KATE STREET

Often drawn to analogue publications and printed matter by their physical presence and predigital imagery. Her work allows the artefacts and related imagery to lead the formation of works. Drawing upon figuration, landscape and cultivation, her work manifests itself through collage and sculpture, creating a new set of suggested narratives. Small scale details from the pages become monstrous through enlargement and her Frankenstein approach to collaging and assemblage. This coupled with industrial remnants, such as hooks, clamps, reels and latex create familiar, yet uneasy, objects. Commodification of the female body is explored through combination of image and objects. Often layered, punctured, stitched and assembled to emphasise surface and tactility, the work aims to elicit a physical reaction from the viewer.


Kate Street graduated from her MA in Fine Art Painting at the Royal College of Art in 2002. Prior to this she had completed her BA Hons in Fine Art (1998-2001) and Foundation Diploma (1997-1998) at Winchester School of Art. In 2006 she completed the PGCSE in Art and Design (14 to 19 years) to support her teaching practice and is now a senior lecturer at UCA.

Since graduating Kate has exhibited in a number of international exhibitions and has curated projects within the UK. Kate has also been selected to undertake artist residencies at Aberystwyth Arts Centre (2011), Helsinki International Artist's Programme, Suomenlinna, Helsinki (2010) and she has won a residency award at the Scottish Sculpture Workshop, Aberdeenshire (2007).







SARAH BAKER

Sarah Baker is a conceptual artist who is intrigued by the culture of luxury and glamour, both real and imagined. Sarah studied at San Francisco Art Institute and Goldsmiths London, and her work encompasses a variety of mediums including film, books and photography. Sarah's interest in fragrance developed after devising her 2014 film, 'Impirioso,' a soap opera-style dramatization about a fictional fashion empire. Sarah wanted to make the empire real. Sarah developed her gallery solo show, 'Sixth Floor,' where she exhibited fragrances as art works. Named after Harrods' exclusive Salon de Parfums located on the sixth floor, Sarah's exhibition playfully interrogated the luxurious and glamorous aesthetic of the high-end fragrance world. The gallery and its shop-front windows were transformed into an exclusive olfactory boutique and showcased the brands first four perfumes—Leopard, Greek Keys, Lace, and Tartan. At the Institute for Art & Olfaction, Sarah quickly came to understand perfume's ability to narrate without words. As a new medium of storytelling, Sarah could construct a mise-en-scéne for the wearer to enact a unique dramatization starring in one of Sarah Baker's scented tales.


